




To picture all that everyone remembers would be impossible. There are so many students with so many memories.

AMERICA'S YOUTH IN CONCERT...THE REALIZATION OF A DREAM


On June 28, 1971, the first 500 participants of America's Youth In Concert came together for the first time. Their gathering was the beginning of the filfillment of a dream. The dream, conceived in the mind of Lynn Stewart Geddes, was that a group of young Americans might be brought together to dramatize to the world the fine quality and high character of American youth, to motivate and reward dedicated performance by youthful music students, and to provide participating students an outstanding educational experience. America's Youth In Concert assembled to fulfill that high purposed dream.

Dreams are on-going things and this dream has experienced continual fulfillment. Since its conception, almost 3000 young Americans have performed under the auspices of America's Youth in Concert. Each year when the participants first assembled together, they were a gathering of individuals, strangers to one another. But they

had a common bond of music--the common interest, the common goal, the common dedication to music as an art and a universal language, and to the performance of music as the highest form of human cooperation.

The list of credits these young Americans have amassed is endless and voices of acclaim still ring throughout Europe and America. Thousands upon thousands of lives have been touched by these students through the performance of their talents for the benefit and enjoyment of others.

Lynn Stewart Geddes, founder and President of Universal Academy for Music, with his lovely wife, Carolyn, constantly at his side, struggled through the many difficulties and frustrations of seeing the idea brought into reality. The Geddes' were the originating force behind America's Youth In Concert and continue to provide the motivating force behind it.






Domus Mariae, PICTURED BELOW, was one of the most remembered locations in Europe.








The students saw for the first time many of the sights they had heard about all their lives. Somehow seeing the real thing brings all that we have heard of to life.


Two things no one can ever forget are: new and delicious European foods and fantastic new friends. The food will always be remembered and the new friendships will last forever.





Remembering that tour directors usually come in pairs wasn't hard. Mrs. Lafferty was always supporting her husband and helping in every way she could.






Unit R Tour Director

Unit L Chaperones



England's Past

This island kingdom stands as an eternal monument to the countless millions of stubborn Britishers who have loved and defended her through the centuries.

Throughout her history, England has seen such colorful people as Henry VIII, with his six wives, Queen Elizabeth I and her glorious reign, William Shakespeare, the tragic figure of Charles I on the executioner's block, and Oliver Cromwell. All Americans are familiar with George III and his role in the American Revolution. Even today we witness the beauty and grandeur of the English Court in the person of Queen Elizabeth II.

Londoners during the centuries have listened to the finest musicians in the world. England can boast of such musical personalities as Purcell, Weber, Bull and Ralph Vaughn-Williams. The "Messiah" was first performed in London in 1843 and Handel last directed it in 1759, a few days prior to his death.

France's Past

The mention of France brings to mind such notables of the past of Charlemagne, Joan of Arc, Louis XVI, Marie Antoinette, Napoleon and Charles de Gaulle.

Long held captive by the bonds of feudalism, France struggled for centuries to gain national unity and identity. She has been a kingdom, an empire, a vassel state and a republic. The "Fifth Republic" and the current one, was established only a little over fifteen years ago. With her unstable governments of the past. France has suffered much. She fell victim to invading German armies three times within seventy years.

Paris is often called "the Capital of France and the world". The peaceful Seine River

and all the beauties of the city are beyond human expression. The Louvre, largest museum in the world, houses the greatest collection of priceless art in the world. Here is the home of Mona Lisa, the Venus de Milo, and many, many other famous pieces.

The French Court was a great patron of the arts. Mozart performed regularly for Marie Antoinette. Haydn was brought to Paris and there wrote his Paris Symphonies. Rameau is considered one of the four most important composers of the Baroque period. Berlioz ranks with the greatest of all composers and Claude DeBussy was the foremost composer of the Impressionist Movement. Even today, the Spirit that is France still breathes and invites the world to partake.

This picturesque city was a peaceful interlude at the concert tour's halfway mark. The quiet streets, friendly people and quaint shops were enjoyed by all participants of America's Youth In Concert, students and staff.











Switzerland's Past

Switzerland, nestled high in the Alps of Central Europe, is one of the most interesting of European nations. For centuries, she was a pawn between the Hapsburg and Holy Roman Empires. She struggled for existence and in the end emerged an independent nation. The well known tale of William Tell and the apple has its setting in the conflict between Austria and Switzerland.

She has remained one of the few truly neutral European nations for almost three hundred years. Her neutrality has enabled her to escape the carnage and destruction of two World Wars.

Switzerland is one of Europes most beautiful and picturesque countries. The Swiss Alps rise to over 15,000 feet while the lowest spot in the country is only 650 feet. This marked contrast in nature creates a beauty hard to describe.

The canals of Venice, home of Marco Polo, the art wonders of Florence, the ruins of Pompeii, ancient Rome and on and on. . . the list is endless.


Italy could also be called the birthplace of western music. For over a thousand years the Catholic Church was the most important influence on western music and the church was centered in Rome.


