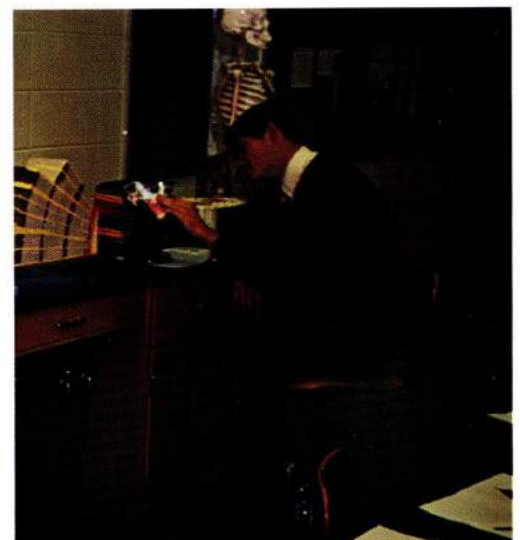
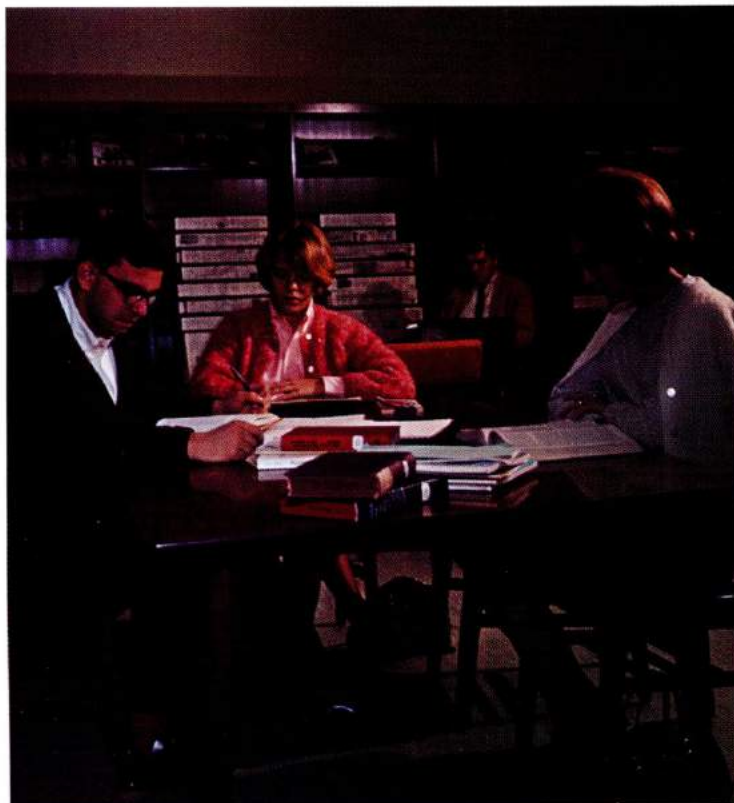

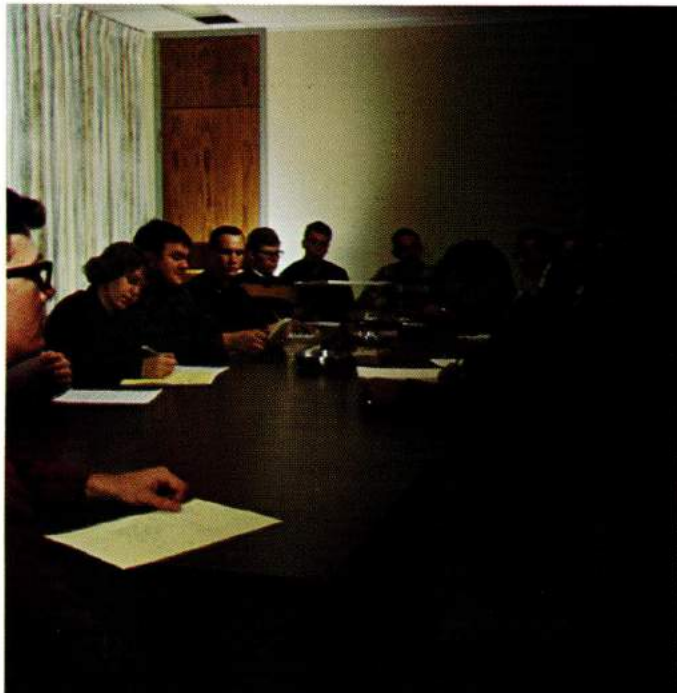

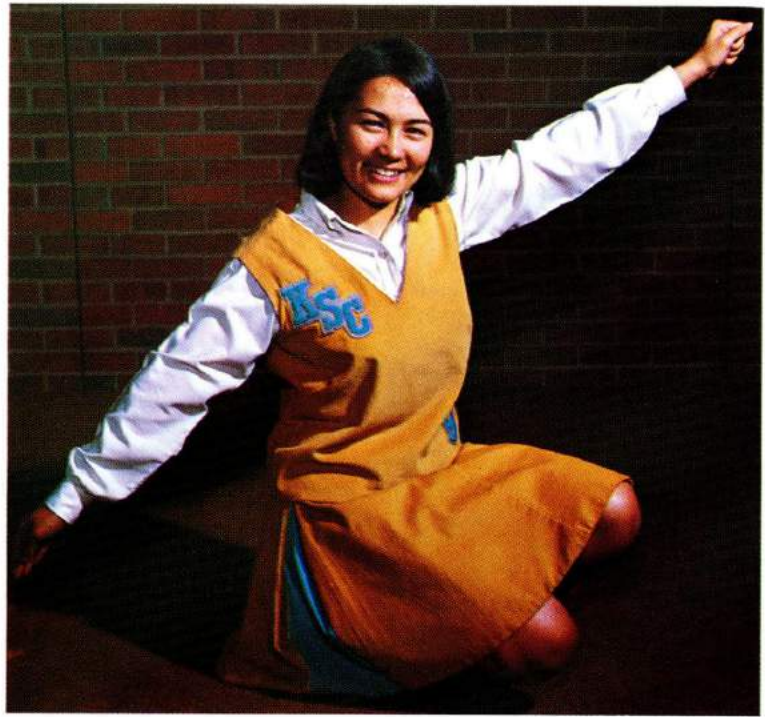

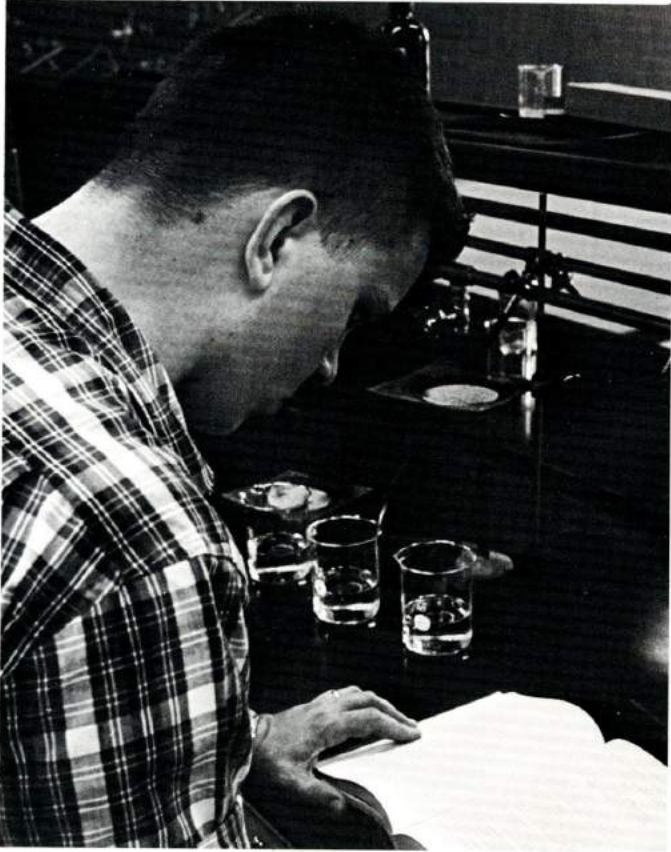


## The Students— at Work

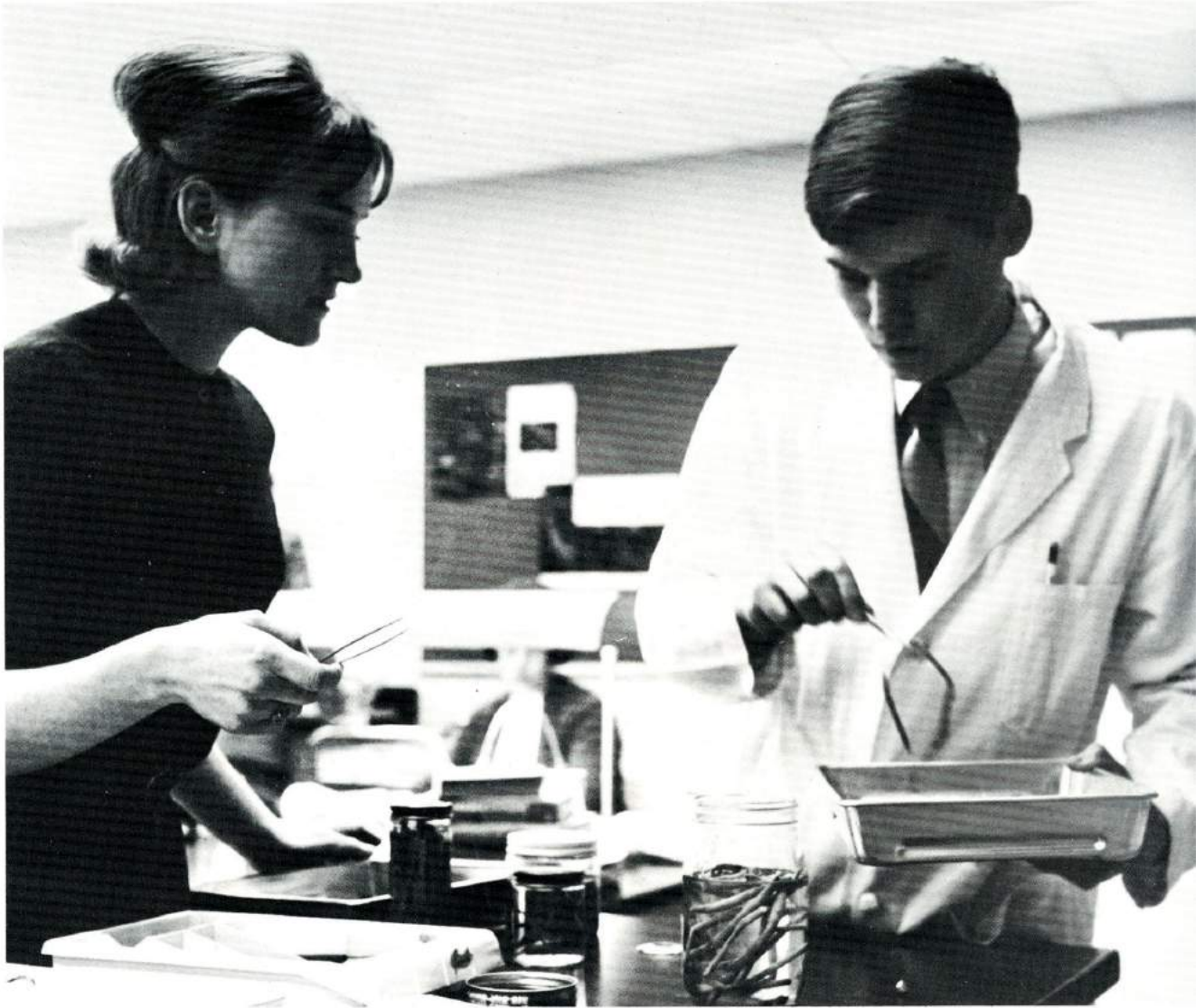

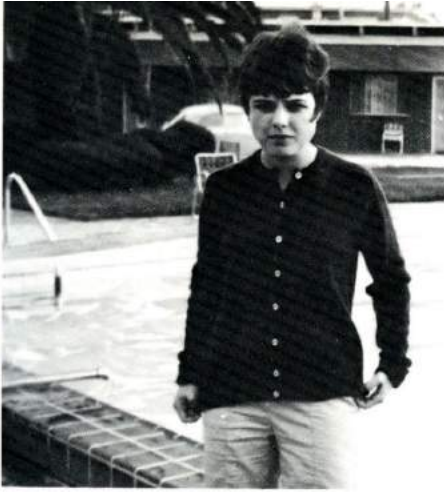

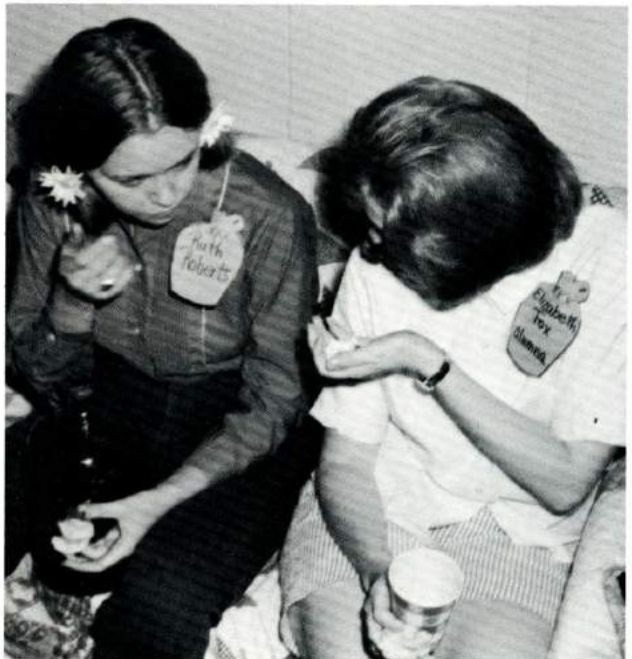

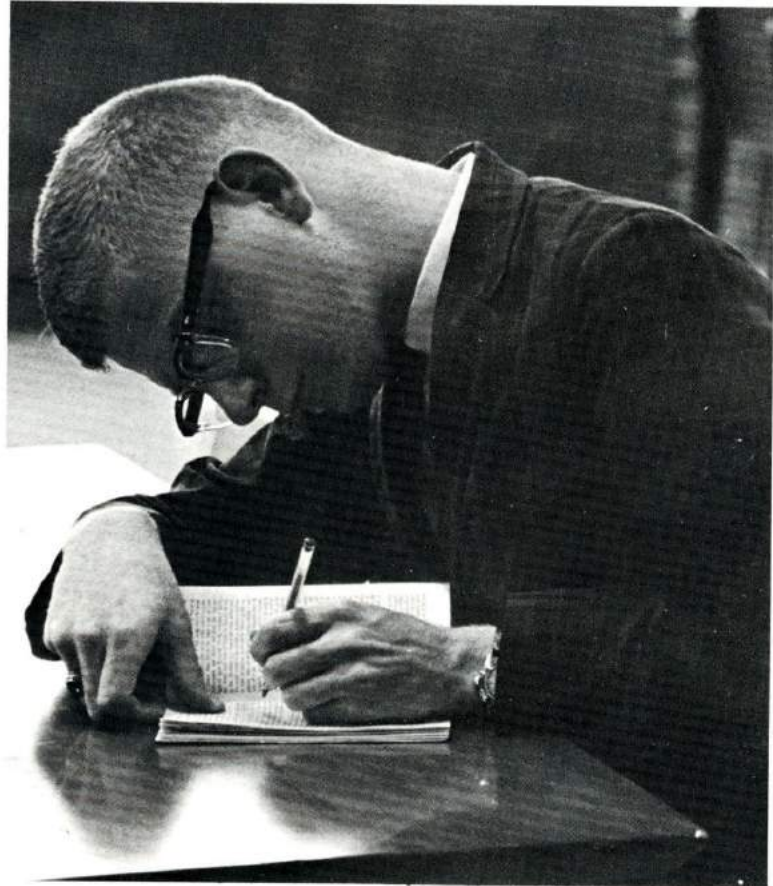

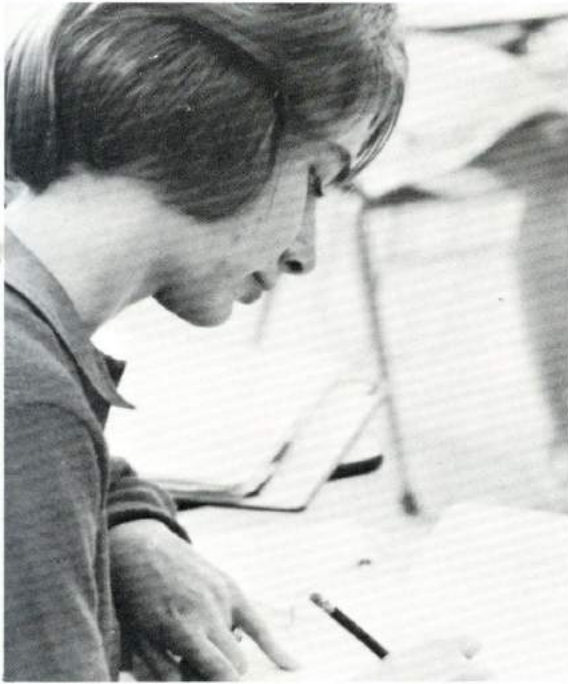




# Beam Staff

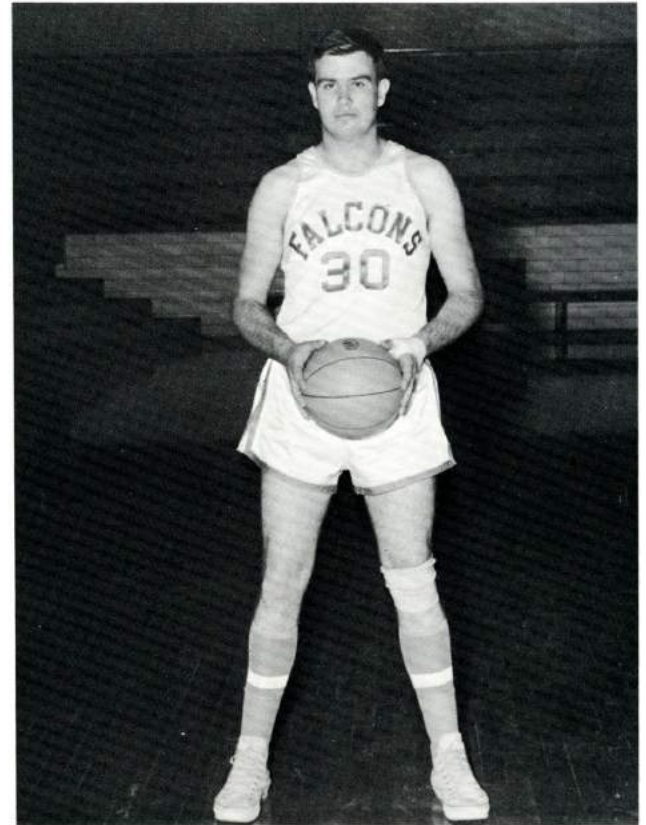

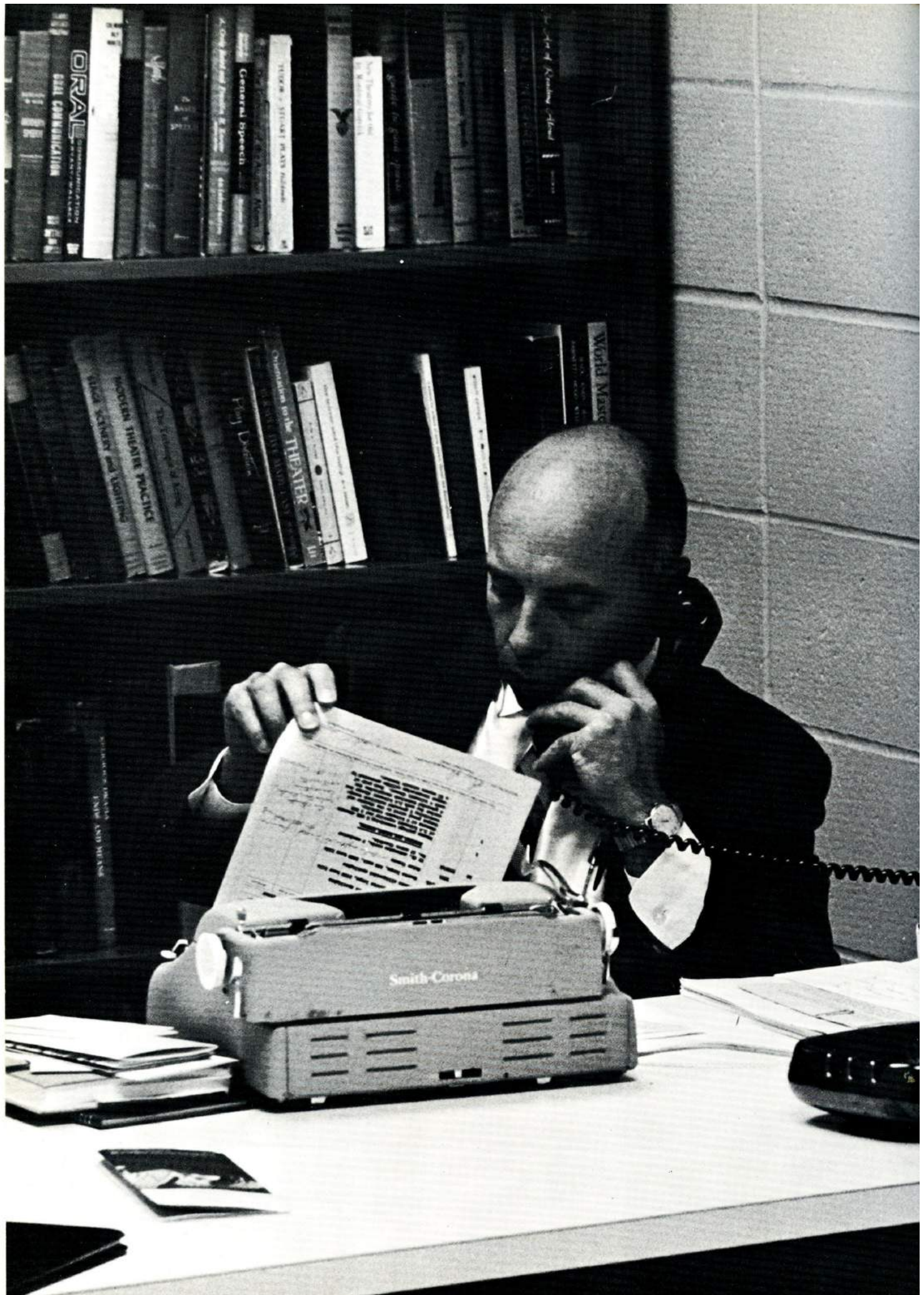

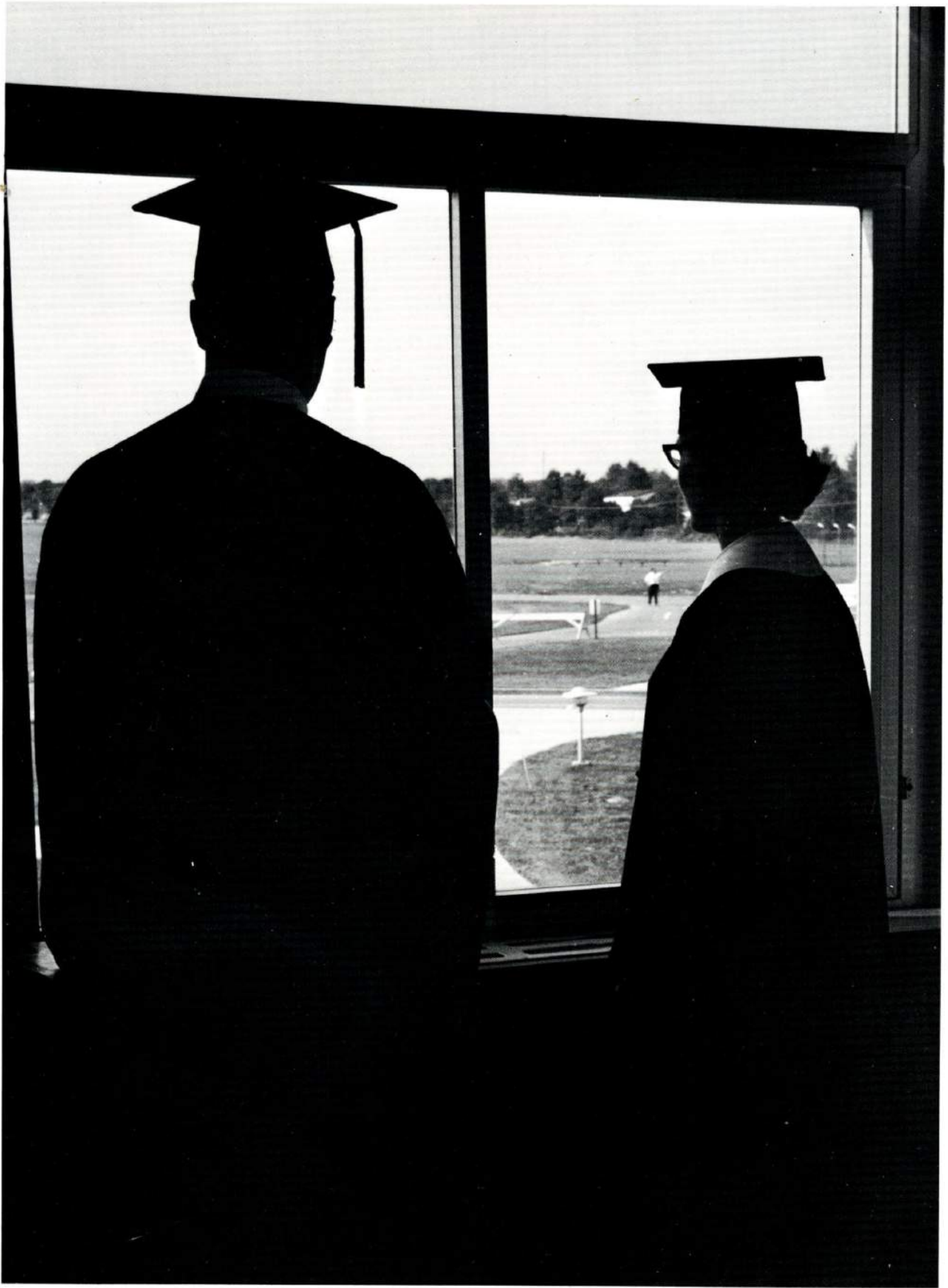

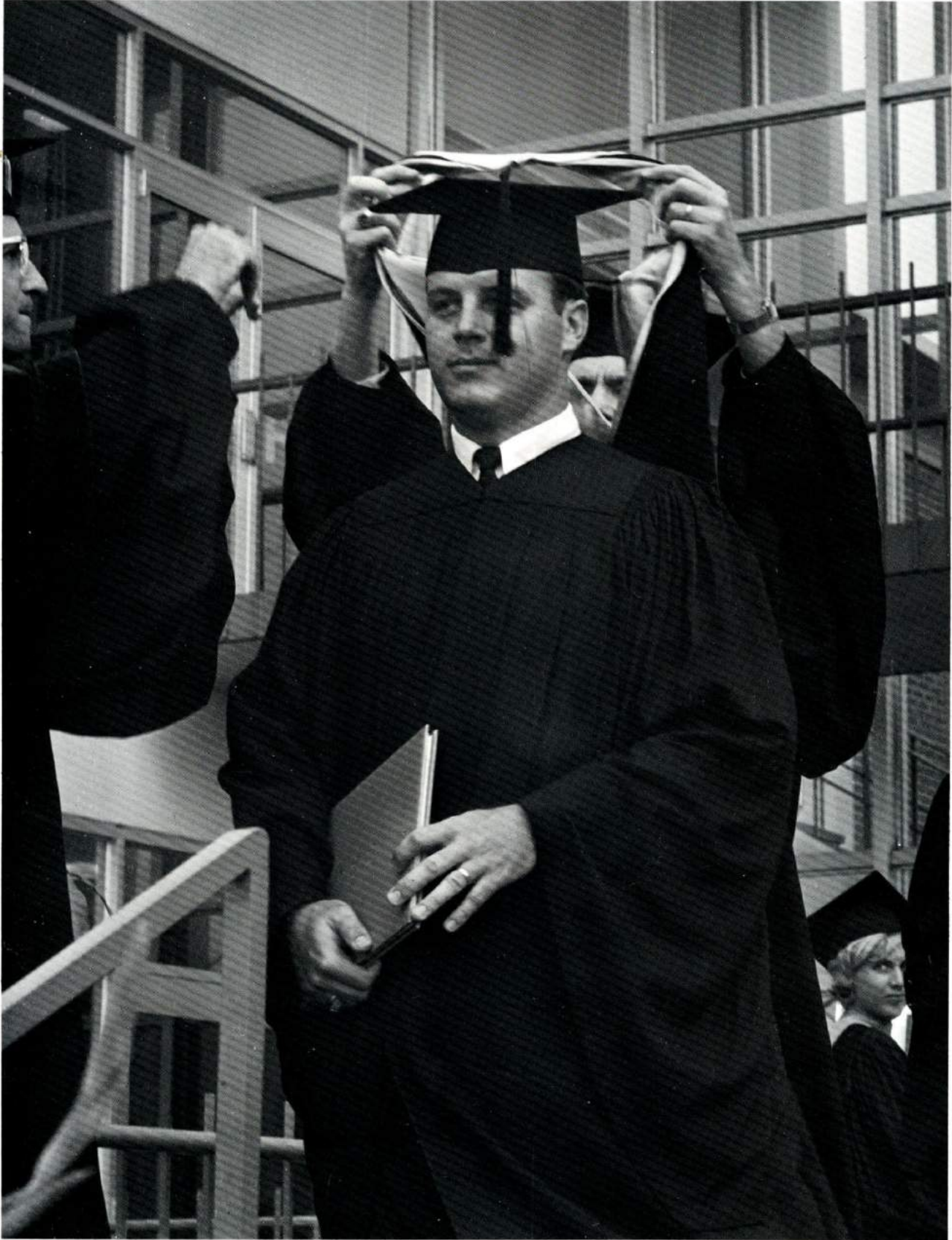

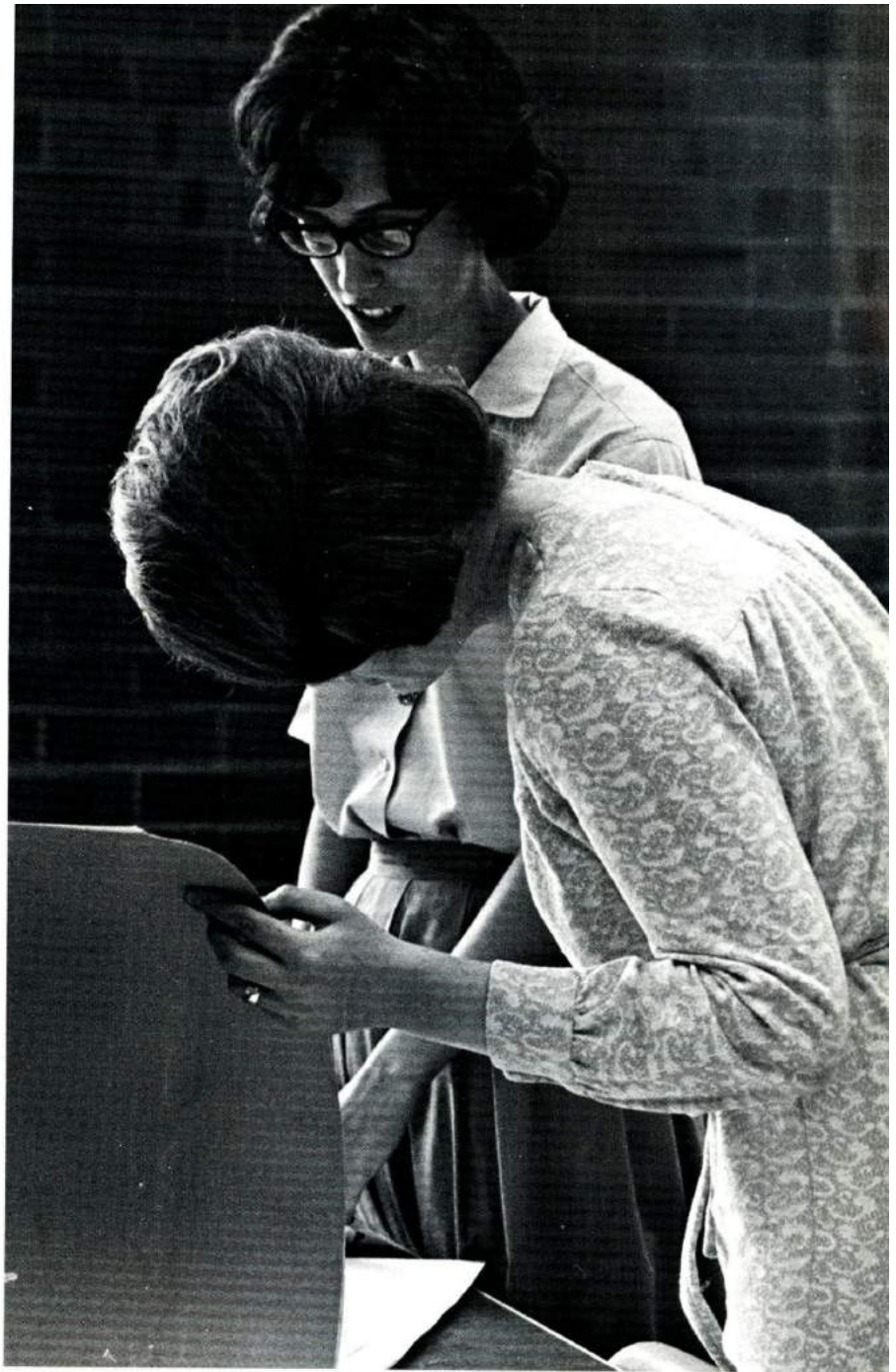
